To address the issue of service charge allotment to the Cantonment Board, Ajmer: No service charges have been allocated to the Cantonment Board, Ajmer, for the financial years 2020-21, 2021-22, 2022-23, and 2023-24. The absence of these service charges over the past four years is a cause for concern. It is imperative to release the service charges (Army) to the Ajmer Cantonment Board promptly. Failure to do so may lead to financial challenges, and in the coming years, the Board could face a deficit situation. Your timely attention to this matter is crucial for the financial well-being of the Cantonment Board.

Therefore, I request the allocation of service charges for the Financial Year 2020-21 at Rs. 5,54,16,056/-, 2021-22 at Rs. 5,55,04,306/-, 2022-23 at Rs. 4,67,48,777/-, and 2023-24 at Rs. 4,67,48,777/-, totaling Rs. 20,44,17,916/- (Rs. Twenty Crore Forty Four Lacs Seventeen Thousand Nine Hundred Sixteen Only). However, the Chief Executive Officer and President of the Cantt. Board, Ajmer, are urged to pursue this matter with higher authorities to secure the release of service charges (Army) to Ajmer Cantonment. Failure to do so may result in the Board facing a deficit in the coming years.
